Take Home Ideas and After Church Treats for November!

To ponder:



How long do things last with you? Take some household objects and guess how long you've had them and how long you're going to keep them. Try it

Dust off your Halos; It's Angel Tree Time Again!

Each year our church participates in this worthy program in which Texas prison chaplains work with incarcerated parents to help them make a connection with their children during the holidays.



A Program of Prison Fellowship

We receive the names of children to purchase gifts for, and we deliver the gifts, along with baskets of food, during the week before Christmas. Each child receives two gifts labeled as being from the incarcerated parent, along with a personal note the parent has written to the child. We also include a book or a game for each of the children in the family from our church family. Angel tags will be be available both Sunday December 3 and Wednesday December 6 at supper. Pick a tag or two, purchase a gift in the \$20 price range, wrap the gift, stick the tag to the gift, and return it to the church office by Wednesday December 13. We also deliver food baskets along with the gifts, so we will be collecting kid friendly non-perishable foods to pack in baskets for the families. The Mission Team wanted to tell you about some of our church's benevolences. We have two Missions for the Month of November – Seafarers' and Fair Haven Food Pantry.

Seafarers' Christmas Shoeboxes

The majority of the things consumed in the US are brought to us via ships. The Port of Houston is the $8^{\rm th}$

largest port in the world. And on each of those ships are about 20-25 sailors. These men and women may have a 9-month contract before they get to go home. Because of being so busy working or maybe because of visa laws, some are unable to get off the ship during the few days the ship is docked at the port. They are usually hungry for conversation and a few laughs.

Seafarers depend a great deal on the services of The Seafarers' Center and the Chaplains that work there for outreach, pastoral care, evangelism, practical service, advocacy and hospitality. One of those items of hospitality is the distribution of Christmas Shoeboxes, which begins soon after Thanksgiving and continues until all of the boxes have been distributed. To give you a sense of how many seafarers enter the Port of Houston in just one month's time, during December of 2015 the chaplains distributed 12,278 Christmas Shoeboxes to seafarers on 538 ships!

Want to help our church gather fun and useful items for 100+ shoeboxes?

Start collecting items such as toiletries, stationery and envelopes, first aid items, Texas items, new T-shirts / tube socks, hard candy, chapstick, puzzles / puzzle books, pens / pencils, playing cards, chewing gum, sewing kits, magazines, shoelaces, and baseball caps. We'll have collection boxes available in November, then join us to pack and wrap on Sunday, November 26th during the Sunday School hour.

Our church also donates \$2500 to The Seafarers' Center each year.

Fair Haven Food Pantry

Fair Haven United Methodist Church on Gessner began a Food Pantry in 1975 to provide emergency food assistance to the Spring Branch-Memorial area. Typically each week, 200 sacks of food are given to families in our community. Because of the devastation so many have endured from the Hurricane Harvey flooding, the need is even greater. Fair Haven is dependent on the donations of congregations and groups in order to help those in need in our area.

Although we collect all year long for the Fair Haven Food Pantry, November is the month we make a special effort in the collection of non-perishable food items for the Food Pantry. The following foods would be particularly welcomed.



Introducing Messy Church to SPBC!

Starting in early 2018, Spring Branch Presbyterian Church will initiate a yearlong experiment of hosting our own Messy Church.

What is Messy Church?

It is a worship service open to all but particularly attractive to those in our neighborhoods that are looking for ways to experience God that are a little more intergenerational, interactive, and informal than what is typically found in our city's churches. A weeknight service might

look like this:

- Welcome time people gathering informally
- Crafts/science/games/mission/activities that are centered around a single biblical theme
- Celebration songs, scripture, and a short little talk that pulls together all of the activities
- A meal to share and continue the conversation
- Suggested activities to engage with at home

The Messy Church model comes from England and is starting to catch on in the US. It is based on the notion that traditional services are alienating to a lot of people that didn't grow up in the church. The songs and rhythm that many of us find so comforting are simply foreign and alienating to lots of people. People want to raise their kids in the faith or be in a faith community themselves, but don't find a connection to God in the mainline/traditional worship and programming.

The model is intended to stand on its own as a worship service. It wouldn't be created with the idea that it is a stepping stone to "real" worship, it is worship. Some of us from SBPC might be drawn to it (we would be), but it isn't intended to be "one more thing to do" for us. It would be for those that are not currently part of our church – or any church. It will meet monthly - it's a bit of work to run and by its nature needs a low commitment from its target audience - but foster its own community. Tentatively we are looking into holding Messy Church the first Thursday of the month starting in February 2018.

The model is intergenerational. It kind of sounds like a mini-VBS. In some ways it is, but all ages here would participate alongside others in the community - young, middle, old, and oldest. Activities would be for all ages, the message and music engaging for all. All would be experiencing God in the messiness of life and learning from each other as a community. Adults aren't there exclusively for the benefit of teaching the young – the relationship is symbiotic. All are there to be the church together.

This month we are forming a group of those interested in carrying this forward for our community. If you are interested in helping please let us know.
