precious in my sight and honored, and I love you..." Isaiah 43

Shalom,

The experiences of Hurricane Harvey are beyond the words of a short article. But, it is important to hear the ancient words of Scripture and be reminded that God is with us through it all. I have been through floods in Iowa, the Hill Country of Texas and Houston. While there is NO question that Harvey is the worst, each is horrible and takes so much time, money and effort to emerge from and rebuild. We will be processing this for a long time. Through this time, we must be wise, share God's strength, grace and encouragement; and assist each other in navigating through very human systems of recovery. And so I share these points, some from my experiences and some from others. We are in a marathon now, not a sprint - everything will take much, much longer than you want it to.

Make sure to pace yourself! Let others help you, even if it seems minor and you know that others have is worse. I'll never forget someone from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance coming into my house, us telling them, "We'll be fine, others have it worse" and them saying, "This is bad! You need help. "If someone asks "what can I do?" tell them something specific – whether it's bags, sandwiches, or hugs. Take pictures - lots of pictures. Establish how high the water was inside and outside of your house. You need to prove how deep the water was as part of your flood claim. Use a yardstick or ruler on the outside of your house to establish the high water mark. File your claim immediately - get in line for adjustors, etc Save all receipts - all of them. Also, you'll also want to keep records of all gifts. As soon as the water recedes, start mitigating the damage. Shopvac out what water you can, remove the wet carpets, remove the baseboards and start removing wet sheetrock.

Cut a line above the damage. The straighter you cut, the easier the rebuild will be. Bag debris and take it outside. Save a square of ruined carpet and ruined carpet pad for the insurance to verify replacement value - if you have multiple carpets, save multiple samples. - Your goal is to get anything wet out of your house so it can begin to dry. Take pictures of any damage you see, wet sheetrock, carpet, furniture, anything you want to claim. Document individual items - each shirt, book, etc. needs to be documented for the claim - if you claim 20 books, photograph the 20 books - be exact and over detailed. Once you get the wet stuff out and open the walls, fans and your air conditioner, and a dehumidifier will go a long way. There are services that do this, but they can be pricey. Anything you do yourself or have friends help you with leaves more resources for rebuilding. Many "clean up kids" include bleach. Spray the studs with bleach as they dry out. Ask for references on contractors and workers.

Be prepared to wait for the good ones. Plastic storage tubs work better than cardboard for storage of your undamaged stuff. During this stressful time, remember to be nice to your adjustor - they will be valuing your loss and establishing the rebuild - every dollar counts, so be a pleasant memory for the adjustor, rather than being "that" person Insurance claims regarding flooding all go through FEMA. The time between the adjustor visiting your house and you getting money takes weeks/months - be patient - there will be lots of claims and the need for many people handling them. When you offer help for a friend, offer something specific, or just bring something like lunch. These are overwhelming times and sometimes the standard answer is "We're fine" even when you know they're not. Let us encourage each other as we seek to be the hands and feet of Christ, showing God's love in action and remind all that Relationships Matter!


Westside Homeless Prevention (WHP) Program

The Mission Team wanted to tell you about one of our church's benevolences. This is our "Mission of the Month" – the Westside Homeless Prevention Program.

The WHP program was created in 1994. It is a 501(c)(3) organization that depends entirely on private individuals, groups, grants, congregations, and businesses to fund its operations. WHP's mission is to prevent and end homelessness for families by providing them with resources and supporting services that lead to self-sufficiency. WHP's program is designed to empower families with children within the Spring Branch Independent School District (SBISD) area to achieve self-sufficiency and permanent housing through personal effort, education and growth. One major objective is to protect the children's education by preventing the families from having to move from one school to another during the same school year. Our church donates \$1200 to WHP each year.

How your donation helps:

- \$5,000 provides 3 months subsidized rent for 3 families
- \$1,200 provides 1st month's rent, utilities, apartment application fees and a bed for each child for a family entering the program
- \$500 provides continuing education courses through ESL, HCC and job-training classes for
 3 parents which increases earning potential
- \$250 provides safe, after-school care for 1 child so a parent can work without worry
- \$100 provides transportation for 1 adult to and from work for 3 months
- \$50 provides one counseling session for 3 families. Therapy can be the key to healing trauma from homelessness
