Greetings, friends and members of Spring Branch!

In Revelations 14:2-3, John records that he "heard a voice from heaven like the roar of many waters and like the sound of loud thunder. The voice I heard was like the sound of harpists playing on their harps, and they were singing a new song before the throne and before the four living creatures and before the elders. No one could learn that song except the 144,000 who had been redeemed from the earth."

This passage tells me something amazing. First, learning to sing new worship songs is not only common, but it is also in our future. Second, John seems to indicate that learning new worship music is not always easy, though it seems to be the will of Christ, who sits on "the throne." This seems to draw on Psalm 150, where the worshipers of God are commanded to praise God with every conceivable type of musical instrument. The apostle Paul must have had a true headache trying to figure out what his churches were to sing since they were all new and quite different from one another. Still, he commends them twice for using "psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs." (See Ephesians 5:19 and Colossians 3:16) We all know what hymns were and are, and we still sing many of them. Likewise, the psalms are familiar to us in that we have 150 of them in the Bible, though there were certainly many more. It may, however, interest you to know that the Greek word, "psalmos" is defined as "a striking, twanging, the striking the chords of a musical instrument." So, instrumental music of all kinds has always been very important in the worship of the Lord.

But these "spiritual songs," or "songs of the spirit," can be a real sticking point. Most scholars recognize that they were songs that are spontaneous and are inspired by the Holy Spirit. In other words, they are new songs. No particular style or genre is prescribed. In a worshiping community, this should just be a natural consequence of experiencing the Lord together in that unique community.

One of the interesting things about being pastor at Spring Branch is how widely varied our musical tastes are. If I take guidance from scripture, I conclude that the music we use must be the music that allows all members of our community to worship. Of course, this is not possible with each and every selection. However, many of you have filled out your hymn request sheets. Thanks you so much. It gives those planning worship a guide to the hearts of our church community. If you have not yet, then we really do want to hear from you. This is an interesting time with new music all around us, new hymnals that contain new things (and leave out some of our favorites). In September, we will begin using those requests. More than simply helping us plan a specific service, they tell us about who we are, and this is not static either. We are always learning new things, including how much we value some of the tried-and-true music of our personal and denominational heritage, as well as our own culture.

So, I end by thanking you for your help and your input. I also pray that we will grow in appreciation of one another and in love for our Lord as we come together in worship. See you Sunday!

The "Mission of the Month" for September is CarePartners. CarePartners is a nonprofit, volunteer led organization that provides support, education, and resources for caregivers and

quality care for those living with memory loss and other challenges of aging. Much of the care is for the vulnerable elderly and individuals with Alzheimer's or related dementia. CarePartners serves all people at no

cost. They provide life-changing care, as well as educational and support services to more than 5,700 people in the Greater Houston area. Their award-winning volunteer Care Team® model includes more than 2,500 individuals who help support six primary programs: Caregiver Education Conferences, Common

Ground, Caregiver Consultation, Second Family, The Gathering Place, and Dementia Day Center.

On Monday, August 28th, we hosted 77 participants from congregations all over the city of Houston for *The Gathering Table*, the first in-person event of this kind held by CarePartners since 2020! We also work with CarePartners on a monthly basis through The Gathering Place, which meets the third Monday of the month from 10:00 AM-1:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall.

September Mission Updates & Opportunities

MAM Back to School Uniform Voucher Drive – SBPC is once again collecting funds for the Memorial Assistance Ministries (MAM) Back to School Uniform Voucher Drive. MAM coordinates with school guidance counselors and local vendors to provide school uniforms for local needy families. MAM's 2022 goal is to provide \$50 uniform vouchers to 5,000 children. Donations can be placed in the offering plate on Sunday mornings until Sunday, September 28, 2022, or mailed to the church office. Mission of the Church to Feed My Sheep: Hot Meals – Currently, SBPC delivers Hot Meals to 34 elderly who generally have mobility problems. These are indeed "hot" chicken lunches prepared by Pappy's Café and delivered by SBPC members on the 4th Saturday of each month, and they are so very appreciated. At various times of the year, other items are provided by the church. These have included Advent and Easter information, hurricane kits and Thanksgiving Pumpkin Bread. Time involved is two to three hours late Saturday morning. This only happens if we have drivers to deliver. Please consider helping with this mission by driving some Saturday. Young Adult Mission Project – In August, our young adult group had the opportunity to create and gather for a retreat at Mo-Ranch. During the retreat, the group enjoyed a time of fellowship, bible study, recreation, and a service project together. The service project the group chose was to package cat and dog food for participants with the Animeals program at Interfaith Ministries of



Greater Houston. The Animeals program provides pet food to participants within the Meals on Wheels Program. The group was able to complete 17 bags of cat food and 33 bags of dog food. The participants in the



We had 85 registered, 4 cancelled due to Covid, and 77 attended.

Our speaker was Dr. Ali-Asghar Ali, Associate Professor at Baylor College of Medicine and Geriatric Psychiatrist at the Michael DeBakey VA MedicCenter. He spoke on A

Positive Approach to Care and gave us tips on how to approach, touch and speak to a person with dementia. Then, Andrea Williams, from CarePartners Dementia Day Care Center led us through some exercises to practice the techniques that Dr. Ali taught us. We rounded out the morning with lunch from our community partners, Jason's Deli. The workshop was a positive time for us all as we chatted with our table



mates during lunch about crafts, games and entertainment ideas that had been successful in our Gathering Place meetings.
