The Pastor Nominating Committee of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church moves Spring Branch Presbyterian Church call Rev. Mark Alan Plunkett as part-time Co-Pastor subject to the Terms of Call, with duties as agreed from time to time with the Session of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church.

What does this mean? It means that as of **September 11**, **2023**, Reverend Mark Plunkett will be on the staff of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church as a full-time Co-Pastor.

Mark comes to us as an old friend/member and as an experienced, ordained Presbyterian Minister (Teaching Elder) of PCUSA. We believe the experience, wisdom and practical knowledge of pastoring a church will be a gift that Mark can share with another Co-Pastor.

For our second Co-Pastor, we are seeking someone with fewer years of experience as a Pastor, but willing to hit the ground running at SBPC. With the second Co-Pastor on staff, Mark will transition to a Part-Time (75%) Co-Pastor (Mark is seeking 3-5 years of employment/service before retirement).

Mark is committed to working with SBPC and Spring Branch Presbyterian Academy to minister to all and to be involved in programs in both the Church and Academy.

Thurkful Grakeful Blessed This is very simple. The fluffy yarn is wrapped around the frame.


#3 – Charger with décor - \$ 6.00


