From the desk of Pastor Mark...

Rev. Dr. E. D. Junkin's letter to First Presbyterian Church, Houston, Texas August 31, 1880

Dr. Junkin traveled from Brownsburg, Virginia, to visit the church in Houston and to see about becoming their new pastor. Upon returning to Virginia, he sent a letter to the faithful back in Houston accepting their call. I invite you to hear a portion of the tender words this rather scary-looking ancestor of mine chose to write:

To the members of the First Presbyterian Church, Houston, Texas

Brownsburg, Virginia August 31, 1880

"My heart continually goes out toward you who constitute my new charge.

Indeed, I am appalled by the greatness and the difficulty of the work, and could not undertake it but for the good promise of the Master – "I will be with you always."

But I want to say to you, that in order to the success of my ministry among you -you must work with me.

The Church can prosper only when the mutual duties of Pastor and People are faithfully performed, and when Pastor and People actuated by love to Christ and to the souls of humans, for Christ's sake, realize their responsibilities and endeavor in the fear of God to discharge them.

There is a very great work to be done in Houston by the Presbyterian Church. Upon me, as your pastor, will rest of course the main responsibility in reference to that work; but I know and you know that I cannot do all of it. *You must help me*.

It is a very great help to a pastor to see the people prompt and punctual in attendance upon the public services of the Church. But not only by your presence can you help and encourage your Pastor; you can by personal influence persuade others to attend services and thus bring them under the influence of the truth.

My prayers will mingle with yours as they ascend to the Heavenly Throne. May the God of all grace keep you and bless you and cause His face to shine upon you. May He cure any that are sick, and may He comfort any who mourn. Pray for me that I may be kept in safety and blessing and be brought back to you fitted for the great work."

NOTE: Rev. Dr. Ebenezer Dickey Junkin is my great-great grandfather and one among many Presbyterian ministers who have served in America since the 1700's.

Center. The Seafarers Center is a multi-denominational outreach to seafarers from around the world who dock at terminals in the Houston Ship Channel.

Imagine working on a ship, far from home, as Christmas approaches. This is reality for countless seafarers who pass through the Port of Houston every day. As the Port Chaplains share a Christmas shoebox with each seafarer, the seafarers experience true joy and excitement. Each Christmas, approximately 10,000 Christmas boxes are provided free of charge to our visiting Seafarers from more than 61 different countries!

Our goal this year is to provide 150+ decorated shoeboxes filled with many useful items to the Seafarers Center. Join us on Sunday, November 26th, from 9:30 to 10:30am in the Fellowship Hall to pack and wrap Seafarers Boxes! Breakfast will be served at 9:00am.

November Mission Updates & Opportunities

Blessing Bags – The Mission Team is collaborating with the Stewardship Committee to assemble Blessing Bags at the Stewardship Luncheon on November 12th. Members can take these Blessing Bags and give to neighbors that are struggling with homelessness.

Thanksgiving Cards to Elderly – We will once again partner with the Academy to complete Thanksgiving cards for seniors at The Reserve, Parkway Place, and Hot Meals on Weekend participants.

Fair Haven Food Pantry – We are continuing to accept donations for the Fair Haven Food Pantry (non-perishable food items, cleaning supplies, plastic grocery bags, paper bags, and paper products).

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – The 4th Saturday of each month we look for individuals to deliver meals to shut-ins. A hot lunch of chicken, mashed potatoes, and green beans are delivered via 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. Family Movie Night – On Friday, December 8th, at 6:30pm we will be hosting a special holiday family movie night in the church's parking lot. The movie will be "The Grinch," and we will be serving hot chocolate and popcorn before and during the movie.

MAM 40th **Anniversary & Back to School Voucher Campaign** – Spring Branch Presbyterian Church was delighted to join our friends at the MAM Annual Luncheon on October 16th as we celebrated the work

we have been able to do together over the last 40 years to help our neighbors in need. Through your generosity, Spring Branch was able to give \$1,460 to the recently completed Back to School Uniform campaign. We were joined by other congregations throughout the area that raised \$67,979 alongside us. The campaign as a whole raised \$144,380.67. Thank you for your generosity!!

It's time to prepare to pack Seafarer's Boxes on November 26th!

On Sunday, November 26th, we will be packing and wrapping shoe boxes at 9:30 AM in the Fellowship Hall, full of goodies to send to the Seafarers' Center at the Port of Houston. We need lots of boxes, so get out there and go shoe shopping! Our goal is to collect over 150 boxes to pack. Ladies' sized boxes are the best, but we can also accept the plastic shoe boxes with lids that you can buy at the dollar store, at Walmart, or other stores.



If your family enjoys selecting, packing and wrapping, consider filling a box (or several) on your own. This has been quite



successful, so we will continue to offer this option. Please bring any fully wrapped boxes to the church by Sunday, November 19th. Laurie would like to guarantee 150+ boxes total, so it would be helpful to know how many we will be packing and wrapping together on the 26th.



November Birthday Celebration!



Stewardship and Conservation



On October 25th, Matt Lassiter gave a presentation on butterflies, bees, and what we can do to help conserve our natural environment. Here are some of the highlights:

Monarch Butterflies – Plant milkweed to feed the Monarchs, but do not buy it from a big box hardware store, as these are doused with pesticides which kill the butterflies. Instead, look online for seeds or check out smaller nurseries about town.

Also, place a water dish with rocks in your garden, or a bird bath with rocks for the bees and butterflies to drink. If you are concerned about mosquitos (which we all are!), you can buy Mosquito Dunk online. It kills the mosquito larvae in standing water but does not hurt bees or butterflies.



Homemade Pesticide for plant aphids − ½ cup of water, ½ cup of rubbing alcohol, and a drop of Dawn Dishwashing Liquid. Spray, leave stand for 30 minutes, Wash off.

If you are overwhelmed by the number of threatened, protected, and nearly extinct animals that you see on TV, pick one that you passionately care about and either contribute money or time to that cause only. If you are looking for something local, the Texas ocelot is a great one!

Church-Wide Retreat to Mo-Ranch Thursday, March 14th-Sunday, March 17th

We have a church-wide retreat in the works for March 14th-17th at Mo-Ranch in Hunt, TX! The theme and schedule will be forthcoming as we make plans for this exciting trip!

This is spring break week, so we're hopeful that we can have a big group go - including our families! This retreat will be Thursday-Sunday, with the option to stay with a small group into Monday.

There will be lots of time for spiritual development, fellowship, recreation, worship, and good food! We are hoping for this to truly be a church-wide retreat, so sign up and let us know that you're coming!

We will be staying at both the Milk Barn and the Westminster Lodge, which face each other on the NW side of Mo-Ranch. (We'll move across the Ranch to hotel rooms for those staying into Sunday night.)

The Milk Barn is more group/family oriented with most rooms having twin sized bunk beds. For those that would like more privacy, the Westminster Lodge is similar to hotel accommodations with private bedrooms.

Here's what our accommodation options look like: **Westminster Lodge:**

 4 separate bedrooms, each with 2 double beds, sleeping up to 16 if completely full. So, couples, extended families, or individuals that pair up with roommates can use these rooms. They will probably go fast, so sign up soon!



Milk Barn:

- 1 Bedroom with a double bed and 1 set of bunk beds, sleeping up to 4.
- 1 Bedroom with a double bed and 1 set of bunk beds, sleeping up to 4.
- 1 Bedroom with 3 sets of bunk beds, sleeping up to 6.
- 1 Bedroom (upstairs) with 4 sets of bunk beds, sleeping up to 8.
- 1 Bedroom (upstairs) with 3 sets of bunk beds and 1 double bed (in a loft), sleeping up to 8.
- There are also 2 bunk houses on the rear side of the Milk Barn. One room will accommodate 14 in bunk beds, and the other room will accommodate 16 in bunk beds.





Some of the programming will include: water activities, a movie night, a scavenger hunt, a mission activity or two, games/puzzles, an evening Vespers under the stars on the tennis courts, morning devotionals, the High Ropes Course, among others! Some of our meals will be cooked at our lodging, and others by Mo-Ranch at the King Dining Hall, and a BBQ by the river on Saturday evening.

There will be a combination of structured group activities and exercises together, mixed with other opportunities for free time around the Ranch.

We will have a Sunday morning worship service led by SBPC at Chapel on the Hill, open to the entire Ranch. We're also in discussion to have some Sunday School classes beforehand, for both adults and kids.

We are asking those who are interested in going to please complete the registration form, reserve your room to secure the space that you'd like, and pay \$75/person to the church, as we have to make a partial payment to Mo-Ranch in order to hold our space.

The total cost is \$185 for adults and \$120 for kids, for the 3 nights, including all meals. The remainder of your balance will be due to the church by Sunday, December 10th. Please see Jorida in the church office if you need an extension on that deadline. Scholarships can be made available to you if needed. Please see Jorida for information as well.

Our goal is to have at least 45 people attend, but we have access to accommodations for up to 76. Even though we may not use them, there are 2 bunkhouses at the rear of the Milk Barn, which combined can house an additional 30 people, totaling to the 76. We can overflow into this space at an additional cost per person, all covered within our tiered fee structure.

If you'd like to attend but would prefer not to drive, accommodations can be made. The Academy has also offered the 12-passenger van to us for the trip.

Some of us will stay over Sunday night, and return home on Monday, March 18th. If you are interested in staying into Monday, you will need to book and pay for your own hotel rooms at Pheasant Run or Wynne/Flato, and pay for the desired King Dining Hall meals.
