## The Year I Learned the Gift of Giving

In high school, my first job was as the janitor in a cheap department store in Chattanooga, Tennessee. It didn't pay well, but it was enough to put some gas money in my pocket.

A few months before Christmas, I was cleaning the electronics department when I noticed a small stereo console on sale for about \$150 (this was in 1975, so \$150 was a little pricey.) It had a stereo radio, a record player, two built-in speakers and an 8-track tape player – top of the line for 1975. I calculated that if I put it on lay-away and paid a certain amount each week, I could buy it for my family for Christmas.

I began the process and made sure I paid on time each week. As Christmas got closer, I picked out record albums for both my parents and both my sisters. I also spoke with our next-door neighbors and arranged to temporarily put the stereo in their garage after I brought it home.

On Christmas Eve morning, I pretended that my VW Beetle wouldn't start, so I could borrow my mom's station wagon. I went to work, finished my shift, made the last payment on the stereo, and loaded the console in my mom's car. When I drove it home, the plan was to pretend it was a big model train set for my neighbor's son; sure enough, my sister saw me unloading it and came over to help me. She even helped me put it in the neighbor's garage.

During the night, after everyone was asleep, I snuck next door, quietly opened their garage door, carried the console to our house, and set it up in the living room next to all the presents.

The next day was a day I will never forget! My sisters woke me up at the crack of dawn yelling something about a huge present sitting next to the Christmas tree. I played dumb until my parents came into the living room with their first cups of coffee. When my sisters saw the look on my parents' faces, it became obvious that no one knew what was going on!

That's when I started laughing. Then I walked over to the console and yanked the box off the top revealing their present. Then I gave them each their album to play on it.

Amazingly enough, I don't remember a thing that I got for Christmas that year. What I remember was the look on my family's faces when they saw their present. It made all the planning, money and effort worth it.

Because that was the Christmas I learned that it is much more blessed to give than to receive!

# Missions of the Month

Because December is such a wonderful time of giving, we have two "Missions of the Month" for December – The Angel Tree Program and the Presbyterian Children Homes and Services (PCHAS) Ornament Tree.

For 2.7 million children in the U.S. their lives may be filled with the abandonment, loneliness, and shame that comes from having a mom or dad in prison. For many,



it may also include following their parents down the same destructive road to incarceration. Angel Tree®, a program of Prison Fellowship, reaches out to the children of prisoners and their families with the love of Christ. This unique program gives us an opportunity to share God's love by helping to meet the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the families of prisoners at Christmas time.

Every year, our church receives the names of about 20 children who live in the zip codes around our church. Through contact with each of the families, we determine items that the children need or want. In addition to two gifts designated from the parent, each child receives a gift from SBPC. Each family also receives a generous food basket. We will be collecting nonperishable foods for these baskets, so watch for collection bins outside the church office. Tags will be available beginning on Sunday, December 10th, before and after worship, as well as on Wednesday, December 13th, at dinner. Be sure to pick up one or two! Here's what you do: select an angel tag (or two). Purchase the gift (*in the \$20 price range*). Wrap the gift, sticking the tag to the front of the package. Please return the gift to the church office no later than Sunday, December 17th.

We are collecting food for Angel Tree Food Baskets, to be shared with families this Christmas. Here are some suggestions:

- Peanut Butter & Jelly
- Mac & Cheese
- Cereal
- Canned evaporated milk
- Chili or Ravioli
- Canned fruits, vegetables, soups
- Spaghetti, Pasta Sauce
- Canned Tuna or Chicken
- Any kid friendly, easy to prepare foods

Our other "Mission of the Month" is the PCHAS Ornament Tree. Instead of buying toys for the needy children at Christmas time, we opt to give monetary donations. These generous gifts allow PCHAS to serve approximately 5000 children and families each year.

During Advent time, we hang ornaments on a Christmas tree. Each of the ornaments has a PCHAS tag attached with a suggested donation amount. You take the ornament home with you and leave the donation in the basket provided. We will donate the entire amount to PCHAS at the end of the month. 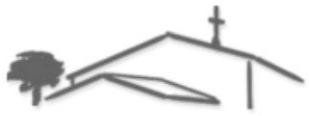

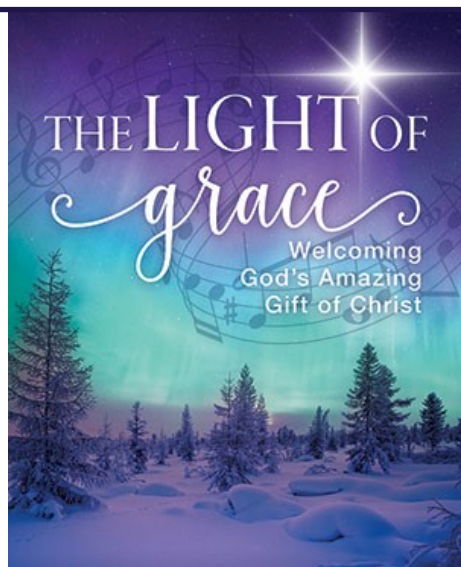
### Bake an Extra Dozen or So Cookies This Season

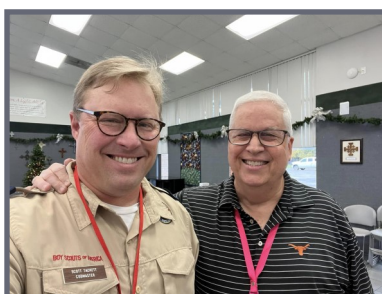

## **Church-Wide Retreat to Mo-Ranch**

Thursday, March 14<sup>th</sup>-Sunday, March 17<sup>th</sup>

We have a church-wide retreat in the works for March 14th-17th at Mo-Ranch in Hunt, TX! The theme and schedule will be forthcoming as we make plans for this exciting trip!

This is spring break week, so we're hopeful that we can have a big group go - including our families! This retreat will be Thursday-Sunday, with the option to stay with a small group into Monday.

There will be lots of time for spiritual development, fellowship, recreation, worship, and good food! We are hoping for this to truly be a church-wide retreat, so sign up and let us know that you're coming!

We will be staying at both the Milk Barn and the Westminster Lodge, which face each other on the NW side of Mo-Ranch. *(We'll move across the Ranch to hotel rooms for those staying into Sunday night.)*

The Milk Barn is more group/family oriented with most rooms having twin sized bunk beds. For those that would like more privacy, the Westminster Lodge is similar to hotel accommodations with private bedrooms.

Here's what our accommodation options look like:

### **Westminster Lodge:**

- 4 separate bedrooms, each with 2 double beds, sleeping up to 16 if completely full. So, couples, extended families, or individuals that pair up with roommates can use these rooms. They will probably go fast, so sign up soon!



### **Milk Barn:**

- 1 Bedroom with a double bed and 1 set of bunk beds, sleeping up to 4.
- 1 Bedroom with a double bed and 1 set of bunk beds, sleeping up to 4.
- 1 Bedroom with 3 sets of bunk beds, sleeping up to 6.
- 1 Bedroom (upstairs) with 4 sets of bunk beds, sleeping up to 8.
- 1 Bedroom (upstairs) with 3 sets of bunk beds and 1 double bed (in a loft), sleeping up to 8.
- There are also 2 bunk houses on the rear side of the Milk Barn. One room will accommodate 14 in bunk beds, and the other room will accommodate 16 in bunk beds.



Some of the programming will include: water activities, a movie night, a scavenger hunt, a mission activity or two, games/puzzles, an evening Vespers under the stars on the tennis courts, morning devotionals, the High Ropes Course, among others! Some of our meals will be cooked at our lodging, and others by Mo-Ranch at the King Dining Hall, and a BBQ by the river on Saturday evening.

There will be a combination of structured group activities and exercises together, mixed with other opportunities for free time around the Ranch. We will have a Sunday morning worship service led by SBPC at Chapel on the Hill, open to the entire Ranch. We're also in discussion to have some Sunday School classes beforehand, for both adults and kids.

We are asking those who are interested in going to please complete the registration form, reserve your room to secure the space that you'd like, and pay \$75/person to the church, as we have to make a partial payment to Mo-Ranch in order to hold our space.

The total cost is \$185 for adults and \$120 for kids, for the 3 nights, including all meals. The remainder of your balance will be due to the church by Sunday, February 18th. Please see Jorida in the church office if you need an extension on that deadline. Scholarships can be made available to you if needed. Please see Jorida for information as well.

Our goal is to have at least 45 people attend, but we have access to accommodations for up to 76. Even though we may not use them, there are 2 bunkhouses at the rear of the Milk Barn, which combined can house an additional 30 people, totaling to the 76. We can overflow into this space at an additional cost per person, all covered within our tiered fee structure.

If you'd like to attend but would prefer not to drive, accommodations can be made. The Academy has also offered the 12-passenger van to us for the trip.

Some of us will stay over Sunday night, and return home on Monday, March 18th. If you are interested in staying into Monday, you will need to book and pay for your own hotel rooms at Pheasant Run or Wynne/Flato, and pay for the desired King Dining Hall meals.
