

From the desk of Pastor Mark...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ!

We all have quotes or passages or stories from the Bible that have special meaning to us: a "favorite" of a beloved friend or relative, or something you found that inspired you during a critical time in your life, or something that was used in a sermon or a Sunday school lesson that you found especially inspiring.

Whatever the reason, <u>Scripture can and should inspire us</u> to do better in our lives and be better servants of Jesus Christ.

But be careful! Often, I have seen Christians - and even some ministers - twist or manipulate a passage to fit into whatever idea they might be holding, or point they are making. In those cases, the Bible can become a dangerous tool in the lives of people who hear it.

Examples:

- In Jeremiah 1:5 God says, "*Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you; before you were born, I sanctified you; and I ordained you a prophet to the nations.*" This passage is often cited as one pertaining to unborn children. Careful study reveals God was specifically speaking to Jeremiah.
- Several passages in Leviticus 11 warn believers against eating shrimp, pork, and several other types of animals. However, many will assert that the New Testament's lesson is why we no longer have to follow these laws.
- Matthew 10:34-36 says the following: "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; and one's foes will be members of one's own household." I am concerned that other Christians, who have missed the message of peace from Jesus, use this Scripture incorrectly to justify war. I see Jesus telling us that his Word will divide people, even within families, like a butter knife divides butter but he will not use the sword as an instrument of killing.

Reading and studying the Bible takes the very best from us. We must read carefully, think about what was read, listen to Bible teachers, and – most of all - use our brains to interpret everything we hear. If we blindly accept whatever we are told about Scripture and its meaning, we are opening ourselves up to manipulation, deception, and misinformation; if that happens, how can we ever be effective workers to spread the Gospel to all the world? Amen!



The Mission of the Month for January is **Comunidades Unidas Pro Salud (CUPS).** CUPS is a Christian ministry founded in 1989 to assist communities in northeastern Mexico and the Rio Grande Valley to improve health and



education, to foster a sense of community, and to provide

volunteers opportunities to serve and be served.

During the month of January, our church will be collecting the following items for CUPS:

- Items for elderly (Such as adult diapers, canes, walkers, crutches, bedside commodes, and wheelchairs)

Each child received 3 Christmas gifts, school and art supplies, and a food basket for the entire family to share. These families were so grateful for everything they received. It wouldn't have been possible without the church's generous donations, and the leadership of Laurie Mitchell. Great job to all!

We have 2 routes with about 14 people on each route, so we usually need a total of 4 volunteers each month. 

February 11 Souper Bowl Day of Caring – Just a reminder that we will be collecting dollars and food items on Super Bowl Sunday, February 11, for the Souper Bowl Day of Caring. All money and food collected will benefit the Fair Haven Food Pantry.

Peace & Global Witness Offering Update – Thank you to everyone who contributed to our Peace & Global Witness Offering on World Communion Sunday. We are happy to report that we collected \$1,125, as compared to \$235 last year. The funds collected were split between the Presbyterian Mission Agency, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, and the Presbytery of New Covenant.

Thank You SBPC PW – The PCHAS (Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services) Single Parent Family Program had 2 families graduate from the program. When they graduate, they are able to take the sheets, towels, and pots and pans they used when living in one of the duplexes. That meant there was a need for replacements for these items for those 2 duplexes. The Presbyterian Women (PW) Board voted to supply \$800 to buy all the items for the 2 duplexes, using money from the PW / PM Mission and Scholarship Fund.





Church-Wide Retreat to Mo-Ranch Thursday, March 14th-Sunday, March 17th

We have a church-wide retreat in the works for March 14th-17th at Mo-Ranch in Hunt, TX! The theme and schedule will be forthcoming as we make plans for this exciting trip!

This is spring break week, so we're hopeful that we can have a big group go - including our families! This retreat will be Thursday-Sunday, with the option to stay with a small group into Monday.

There will be lots of time for spiritual development, fellowship, recreation, worship, and good food! We are hoping for this to truly be a church-wide retreat, so sign up and let us know that you're coming!

We will be staying at both the Milk Barn and the Westminster Lodge, which face each other on the NW side of Mo-Ranch. (We'll move across the Ranch to hotel rooms for those staying into Sunday night.)

The Milk Barn is more group/family oriented with most rooms having twin sized bunk beds. For those that would like more privacy, the Westminster Lodge is similar to hotel accommodations with private bedrooms.

Here's what our accommodation options look like: Westminster Lodge:

• 4 separate bedrooms, each with 2 double beds, sleeping up to 16 if completely full. So, couples, extended families, or individuals that pair up with roommates can use these rooms. They will probably go fast, so sign up soon!



Milk Barn:

- 1 Bedroom with a double bed and 1 set of bunk beds, sleeping up to 4.
- 1 Bedroom with a double bed and 1 set of bunk beds, sleeping up to 4.
- 1 Bedroom with 3 sets of bunk beds, sleeping up to 6.
- 1 Bedroom (upstairs) with 4 sets of bunk beds, sleeping up to 8.
- 1 Bedroom (upstairs) with 3 sets of bunk beds and 1 double bed (in a loft), sleeping up to 8.
- There are also 2 bunk houses on the rear side of the Milk Barn. One room will accommodate 14 in bunk beds, and the other room will accommodate 16 in bunk beds.



Some of the programming will include: water activities, a movie night, a scavenger hunt, a mission activity or two, games/puzzles, an evening Vespers under the stars on the tennis courts, morning devotionals, the High Ropes Course, among others! Some of our meals will be cooked at our lodging, and others by Mo-Ranch at the King Dining Hall, and a BBQ by the river on Saturday evening.

There will be a combination of structured group activities and exercises together, mixed with other opportunities for free time around the Ranch. We will have a Sunday morning worship service led by SBPC at Chapel on the Hill, open to the entire Ranch. We're also in discussion to have some Sunday School classes beforehand, for both adults and kids.

We are asking those who are interested in going to please complete the registration form, reserve your room to secure the space that you'd like, and pay \$75/person to the church, as we have to make a partial payment to Mo-Ranch in order to hold our space.

The total cost is \$185 for adults and \$120 for kids, for the 3 nights, including all meals. The remainder of your balance will be due to the church by Sunday, February 18th. Please see Jorida in the church office if you need an extension on that deadline. Scholarships can be made available to you if needed. Please see Jorida for information as well.

Our goal is to have at least 45 people attend, but we have access to accommodations for up to 76. Even though we may not use them, there are 2 bunkhouses at the rear of the Milk Barn, which combined can house an additional 30 people, totaling to the 76. We can overflow into this space at an additional cost per person, all covered within our tiered fee structure.

If you'd like to attend but would prefer not to drive, accommodations can be made. The Academy has also offered the 12-passenger van to us for the trip.

Some of us will stay over Sunday night, and return home on Monday, March 18th. If you are interested in staying into Monday, you will need to book and pay for your own hotel rooms at Pheasant Run or Wynne/Flato, and pay for the desired King Dining Hall meals.


