

From the desk of Pastor Mark...

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

My fifth-grade year of school was the most memorable by far. I was blessed to be placed in the classroom of Mrs. Mary Matern, the best teacher I ever had. And it became my favorite year.

She was TOUGH – especially since many of us were pretty silly in our behavior. She kept a tight leash on behavior in her classroom, and she worked us really hard – much harder than any teacher I had previously. I remember coming home from school and throwing my textbooks against my wall because of all the homework I had. But I did it all – every page, every problem.

The reason I did all the work – and everyone else did too – was that were afraid of disappointing her! Yes, she was tough, but she loved us and was always very pleased when we did well. Yes, she was strict, but she never carried a grudge from one day to the next; if you had a bad day in her class, it didn't count against you on the next day. She still smiled at you.

Whenever we got too restless or noisy, her favorite thing to say was, "Okay, young people, let's go run a 600." This meant that everyone in the class had to pile out of the door as quickly as we could, run one big lap around the big playground (600 yards!), and then return and line up in front of her door. We did this no matter the weather (yes, one time we ran in the rain).

On the last day of school, we played games and had an end-of-year party. We all cleaned out our desks, turned in all our textbooks, and collected our report cards. Then it was time to say goodbye. We all knew we would see her the next year because she wasn't going anywhere, but we all cried because she wouldn't be our teacher anymore. It was a tough day, to say the least.

Whenever I think of Mrs. Matern, I hope she is proud of me. This wonderful woman went to her Savior many years ago after the only fight she probably ever lost – one with cancer. It breaks my heart to think of her suffering, but I'll bet she fought cancer long and hard.

In a small way, I compare the relationship I had with Mrs. Matern to the one the Apostles had with Jesus. Jesus worked his Apostles hard; Mrs. Matern worked us hard. Jesus kept going, no matter what; Mrs. Matern did too. Jesus didn't take excuses; Mrs. Matern didn't either. And no one wanted to ever disappoint either of them!

It is a wonderful thing to have a great teacher. Almost all of us have at least one, and chances are good that one great teacher changed you – like the greatest teacher of all changes us today.



The "Mission of the Month" in April is Summerhouse Houston. Summerhouse was founded in 2011 by a mother, Donna Fruge, who has a daughter with an intellectual disability, named Summer. The family could not find the right next step for Summer after high school. They wanted Summer to stay connected with her community and continue to develop work, social, and life skills, so Summerhouse was created.

Summerhouse offers community-based

day services and supported employment services that are driven by the interests, needs, and strengths of those they serve.



Members of the day services spend time in the community doing activities of their choice including volunteering and participating in social activities, classes, and more!

Through the supported employment program, they support members and referrals through the Texas Workforce Commission to find competitive, integrated employment. Summerhouse also provides coaching to ensure long term success on the job. In addition, Summerhouse members volunteer in the community through partnering with 28 non-profit organizations throughout Houston. During 2023, Summerhouse members contributed 400+ volunteer hours per month.



This special fundraising event will showcase the life-changing work that we are doing in our community. You will hear inspiring stories from PCHAS staff and the families they care for. The theme this year is "Dare to Dream!"

Our church will have four Table Hosts – Sarah Dikeman, Marguerite Priest, Jeannie Stockton, and Miguel Carlin. In the next few weeks, one of these individuals will probably be contacting you to see if you would like to attend the luncheon, but feel free to contact them first. We always have so much fun, great fellowship, good food, and supporting a great charity.

Task Force Needed

In our 2024 budget, under Mission, we placed a new category called "Seminary Student" in the amount of \$3000. This scholarship was proposed because the Pastor Nominating Committee, upon approaching the seminaries for prospects, found that only 25% of their students were planning to lead a church upon graduation. In line with our goal of (1) becoming noticed in the Presbyterian world, and (2) having a few prospects in our pocket for the pastor succession process, we got a little ahead of ourselves and floated the idea out to the seminaries.

The result has been 120 applicants to date. We want to form a task force of 3-5 members to do the following:

- 1. Create parameters for the scholarship(s).
- 2. Review the applicants
- 3. Choose from them for Fall acceptance.

This is a short-term task force of a few months. If you would be interested in volunteering for this worthy job, please let Pastor Mark know. No experience necessary!! We will guide you.




