From the desk of Pastor Mark...



My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

When I arrived at Spring Branch PC, I was given three specific duties to focus on:

- 1. Build relationships with the Academy staff, teachers, students, and parents.
- 2. Preach!
- 3. Work with and mentor the future co-pastor that will be hired.

I have embraced those duties – as well as all the others that are part of being a pastor. I even found time to start things that will hopefully add to the overall ministry of our beloved church.

Because I was a teacher for many years, I was able to work with education students and student teachers. So, I have real-world training on mentoring our future co-workers. I often imagine what it is like to be in their shoes, and then I began to plan their training program.


When I was in seminary, many of my classmates were NOT truly given an opportunity to learn on the job when they worked in churches. I knew many who were given only a few things to do, such as work with the youth group, teach one Sunday school class with an established curriculum already in place, and perhaps lead the Lord's Prayer during worship. If they got to preach one time, it was usually because it was part of the contract with the seminary. This model is NOT a good training model and it does NOT produce quality church pastors!

I was SO BLESSED! I virtually led everything in two different churches and took on almost a co-pastor role in a third – all before I graduated from seminary!

I decided long ago that anyone coming to serve at SBPC will be "jumping into the deep end of the pool." He or she will be expected to serve quickly as a partner in ministry, not a junior partner. If I am helping to "train up" someone to lead our church, that person deserves opportunities to try new things, take a variety of leadership roles, and plan and lead worship. This will also be true for any future seminarians we bring into our church in the coming years.

All of this will add to the overall ministry of our church. We are also in conversations with seminaries about serving as a "pipeline" for future seminary interns who wish to work in churches. If they come to SBPC, they will receive multiple opportunities to serve and to grow in their own calls to ministry – as well as opportunities to grow in their own individual faith.


Spring Branch Presbyterian Church established the Academy in 1971 to meet the community's need for quality childcare and preschool education. Under the full sponsorship and authority of Spring Branch Presbyterian Church, we strive to operate under the policies and guidelines of the church and its preschool ministry.

Spring Branch Presbyterian Academy is our primary benevolence, providing Christian childcare to the youngest members of the community. The Academy currently has 245 kids and 43 staff

members, which is the maximum number of kids our facilities can handle.

Spring Branch Presbyterian Academy provides:

- Day care with preschool learning experiences for children ages 6 weeks though pre-kindergarten.
- After-school care and summer camp for pre-kindergarten through 5th grade.
- "Worship on a Weekday" (WOW) where they have a time of worship with Bible stories, prayer, and songs in the afternoon one day a week.
- During the summer, the Academy includes a Summer Camp for school-aged children. The camp features Vacation Bible School as an integral part, plus "Mission Mondays" which is a different mission project on a Mondays.
 - Mondays", which is a different mission project on a Monday each month.



- Private pre-kindergarten classes.
- In addition to our wonderful teachers and curriculum, The Academy offers a music and Spanish program each week. They also supplement their curriculum with STEAM, fitness, cooking, science, and art classes to enrich the program. Optional activities include: Gymnastics, Tumble Tykes, Soccer Shots, Piano, Arts Alive, and Dance.



Family Movie Night – Our next movie night will be on March 22nd in The Gathering Place at 5:45pm. The movie will be St. Patrick's Day themed showcasing the movie *Luck*. This movie is about a girl that has some of the worst luck, yet unveils the unseen life lessons bad luck teaches us. It provides a new perspective on how to look at bad situations in a new light. Please feel free to bring a camping chair or blanket to sit on during the movie. Hot chocolate and light refreshments will be available. We hope you will join us!

Blood Drive – A big thank you to Ashley Powell for helping coordinate the February 11th event. Also thank you to all who donate for this wonderful cause. We had a total of 8 whole blood donations!

Feed My Starving Children – Thank you to the 30 SBPC volunteers and Girl Scouts from Troop 124182 that helped to pack meals at the Pines Presbyterian Church *Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) MobilePack*™ event on Friday, February 23, and Saturday, February 24! During our two shifts, we packed 225 boxes of food, which resulted in 132 kids being fed for a year. Our group joined 550 volunteers in our area to help pack a total of 576 boxes of food, which will help 340 kids being fed for a year!

SBPC Hot Meals on Weekends – On February 24th, our Hot Meals on the Weekend program delivered 25 meals to seniors in our area. We also want to send a special thank you to our friends at the Spring Branch Memorial Arc who created valentine cards to give to our recipients. We deliver meals on the 4th Saturday of each month. We have two routes, so we usually need a total of 2 pairs of volunteers each month. Please contact Lu Taylor if you are interested in volunteering to deliver meals once a month.



Our Mo-Ranch Retreat, "Adventure Is Out There!", is just around the corner! We will be going to the Texas Hill Country on Thursday, March 14th — Sunday, March 17th. The total cost per person is \$185 for adults and \$120 for kids, for 3 nights, including all meals. Sunday, March 3rd, is the last day to register to attend. Please see Kay Craig, Laurie Mitchell, or Ethan Mitchell if you'd like to attend.

There will be lots of time for spiritual development, fellowship, recreation, worship, and good food! There will be a combination of structured group activities and exercises together, mixed with other opportunities for free time around the Ranch. We will have a Sunday morning worship service led by SBPC at Chapel on the Hill, open to the entire Ranch.

We will be staying at both the Milk Barn and the Westminster Lodge, which face each other on the NW side of Mo-Ranch.

RE-Introducing Messy Church to SPBC!

From February 2018 - March 2020, Spring Branch Presbyterian Church hosted our own Messy Church on the first Thursday of every month!

What is Messy Church?

It is an intentionally intergenerational worship service open to all but particularly attractive to those in our neighborhoods that are looking for ways to experience God that are a little more intergenerational,

interactive, and informal than what is typically found in our city's churches. A weeknight service might look like this:

- Welcome time people gathering informally
- Crafts/science/games/mission/activities that are centered around a single biblical theme
- Celebration songs, scripture, and a short little talk that pulls together all of the activities
- A meal to share and continue the conversation

It attracted a number of young families from our community that you'd never met. They still will ask if Messy Church will come back post-COVID. People want to raise their kids in the faith or be in a faith community themselves, but don't find a connection to God in traditional worship.

We'd like to restart Messy Church at SBPC, but for that we need volunteers including:

- 4 core volunteer creative young-at-heart leaders to plan and coordinate Messy Church each month, identifying sessions (these can start with published materials), pulling together or purchasing supplies (the sessions could be split so one leader is lead each month, or three times per year); quarterly or biannual planning meetings, email contact and task execution.
- 2 volunteers to intentionally work to build relationships among the Messy Church community. Requires attendance each month, willingness to talk about faith, and looking for opportunities to engage, possibly planning joint service projects etc.
- 1-2 volunteers or paid staff to coordinate and serve snack and dinner (could be ordering pizza and making salad). Requires attendance.
- 1-2 volunteers or staff to assist with leading music; requires a musical gift, attendance and some coordination with the core leadership.
- 1 volunteer or staff member to manage community outreach and marketing; 1-3 hours per month.
- 6-8 additional volunteers run craft and game tables each month during the service, these may be a mix of youth and adults; the commitment is to arrive 20 minutes early and stay to clean up table after service; 2.5 hours per month.
- Your prayers and invitations to the community to come, by, and eat!

There are four Catholic Churches in the Spring Branch area that host Friday Night Fish Fry's.

- St. Jerome (8825 Kempwood) The Fish Fry's are on the east side of their campus in the Parish Activity Center at 2749 Hollister. You will have a choice of either Baked Catfish or Fried Catfish. The plates are \$12 for two pieces, and \$15 for three pieces.
- ♦ St. Cecilia at 11720 Joan of Arc (just south of I-10 off of Bunker Hill) serves from 5:30-8:00, and has a standard Fish Fry Plate (\$12 for adults, \$10 for seniors, \$7 for kids under 10. Add shrimp for \$3/plate).
- Our Lady of Czestochowa at 1731 Blalock serves from 5:00-8:30 and has a Fish and Shrimp plate for \$15 with \$3 desserts.
- St. John Vianney at 175 Nottingham Oaks (west of Dairy Ashford off of Memorial) has various prices and meals. Their Shrimp Scampi is \$16 and is offered on March 22nd. You need to make a reservation online and pay online. There are a limited number of tickets at the door for \$20. They serve from 5:30-7:30.

Some of the churches don't serve their Fish Fry during Spring Break, March 15th.


2024 PCHAS Luncheon

The Northern Tier High Adventure in Minnesota was nothing short of a life-changing experience for us scouts from Troop 478. In August, we embarked on a week-long journey that took us deep into the heart of the Boundary Waters, immersing us in the raw beauty of nature and disconnecting us from the digital world.

With the wilderness's strict rules, limiting campsite occupancy to nine people, we split into two groups, each forging their own path through the Boundary Waters. Carrying all the gear necessary for six days and nights was not a small challenge. From camping essentials to cookware,

personal items, and our trusty canoes, we were self-reliant in every sense. It was a challenge, but the rewards were immeasurable.

The scenery was nice. The cool, clear waters mirrored the vibrant blue skies, creating a mesmerizing vista that etched itself into our memories forever. Our days were filled with paddling, navigating the waters, and taking in the untouched wilderness that surrounded us. We even had the thrill of catching a pike for dinner one night, a true taste of survival in the wild.

Nature had more wonders in store for us. Witnessing a bald eagle soaring overhead was a powerful reminder of the beauty and majesty of the natural world. The discovery of a 600-year-old Cypress tree left us in awe, grounding us in the vastness of time. The hieroglyphics painted by the Ojibwe Indians told stories of ancient civilizations, connecting us to the rich history of the land we were exploring.

In total, my group paddled an impressive 58 miles, earning us the coveted 50-miler patch, a testament to our determination and teamwork. The other group covered even more ground, tallying about 65 miles of paddling. Luck was on our side, as the rain held off during our journey, allowing us to fully appreciate the wild beauty around us.

Returning to the "civilization" of the Boy Scout base camp was a bittersweet moment. The hot shower and ice cream were luxuries we had earned, but they marked the end of our immersive adventure. We left Northern Tier with a newfound appreciation for the power and resilience of nature, and a deeper sense of camaraderie with our fellow scouts.

The Northern Tier High Adventure was more than just a trip; it was a transformative experience that tested our limits, forged lasting memories, and left us with a profound respect for the wild places that shape our world.






