From the desk of Pastor Mark...

Blood Drives are something that has occurred at our church for as long as I can remember. I was unable to donate for many years due to the various meds I must take, but rules for donors have loosened considerably. Now I joyfully donate every chance I get here at our church.

There are many reasons that people donate blood:

- They understand how it can save a life.
- They picture a small child in need of blood.
- They have a rare or unusual blood type that is hard to find, such as:
 - ◊ AB negative (less than 1% of the population has it)
 - ◊ B negative (2% of the population)
 - ◊ AB positive (3% of the population)
- They work in the medical field and see the importance of blood donations every day.
- They owe a debt!

That last reason is the one that gets me to donate... six people donated for me way back in 1986; they literally saved my life.

In the summer of 1986, I underwent major surgery on my abdomen, and it was a very difficult surgery. Fortunately for me, the surgeon was an expert in the type of surgery I needed. Still, I lost a lot of blood during and after the surgery was complete, so I needed six units to replace it. I know that one of the physical education teachers from the school where I worked came to the hospital and donated in my name; I don't know who else did.

Whoever they were, I have always been grateful for their gifts.

It is often said that if you owe a debt, you should resolve it as quickly as possible. But there is no way for me to resolve this debt directly... other than to donate blood whenever I can. Jesus reminds us that we should be caring for one another because it would be the same as caring for him (Matthew 25:31-46).

I hope you will also donate the next time we have a blood drive here at Spring Branch PC (July 13th!). It only takes a few minutes, it doesn't hurt (much), and you could literally be saving someone's life.

Don't you think Jesus would be proud of you? I think he knew a little about saving people...

Amen!

The Mission of Yahweh

The Mission Team wants you to know about some of the benevolences our church supports. The "Mission of the Month" for July is The Mission of Yahweh, which is a faith-based, non-denominational emergency & transitional shelter that provides homeless women and children with food, clothing, shelter, and services.

The Mission is one of only a few shelters for homeless women and their children, and has served Northwest Houston since 1961. SBPC has been committed to supporting the Mission of Yahweh for many years, through our financial benevolences.

In addition, our congregation supports the Mission throughout the year by conducting donation drives. We also have many members and friends that donate items to the resale store. Recently, the mission received 130 new twin XL mattresses. They are in need of sheets that will fit these mattresses. 

Finding Resilience, Joy, and Our Identity in Jesus Christ

Suggestions for Leaders by Joyce MacKichan Walker

In this Bible study, we will explore resilience. This is modeled for us by several biblical characters, gospel and epistle writers, as well as Jesus. So, what exactly is resilience?

Resilience is the ability to spring back into shape and to adapt well in the face of adversity, trauma, tragedy, threats, or stress—such as from family, relationships, health, workplace, and financial stressors. People who survive and thrive well in change are resilient.

The Bible study is also about joy. How do we find joy in a chaotic world? Christian joy may be different from how a lot of people define joy.

Joy is sometimes confused with happiness. For Christians, joy can occur while we are in the midst of difficult circumstances. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded by love and followed by peace. [Gal. 5:22-23] Trusting in God when we are in trying times can fill us with glorious joy and peace. We have joy in our suffering, because ultimately our joy is found in Jesus Christ.

We will also seek to rediscover our identity.

Identity is more than who we are or who we show ourselves to be. At its core, it points to our humanity. Our core identity is not found in our titles, our positions, our spouses, our partners, or our possessions. For Christians, our identity is found in Jesus Christ.




Celebrate July Birthdays!



HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS



The International District would like to remind everyone that Hurricane Season is upon us. We all need to be smart and plan ahead for all kinds of disasters: natural, man-made, technological and terrorist related. In Southeast Texas, however, the most likely disaster scenario is a Hurricane.

BEFORE THE HURRICANE

- Monitor local TV or AM 740 KTRH
- Check supplies; especially water
- Fuel Vehicles & Generators
- Cover Windows with Plywood
- Bring in all objects that could become missiles
- Take pictures of property & contents for insurance purposes

DON'T FORGET THE PETS!

Pet disaster kits should include: medications, first aid kits, sturdy leashes and collars, carriers to transport pets safely, current photos with owner or family members, food, potable water, litter/pan, muzzle, can opener, and toys.

5 GALLONS OF WATER, PER PERSON, PER DAY.

STOCK EMERGENCY SUPPLIES

>> *at least 72 hours worth* <<

- First Aid Kit
- NOAA Radio & Batteries
- Flashlight & Batteries
- Extra Eye Glasses
- Bottled Water & Non-perishable Food
- Clothing & Bedding
- Toilet Paper & Personal Hygiene Items
- Medications & Prescription copies
- Cash & Credit Cards
- Photo ID & Important Documents
- Baby & Elderly Necessities

Make a check list of necessary pre-hurricane preparations and review with your family. Review it again when there is a storm in the Gulf. Discuss evacuation plans with your family.


Check Radio 740 and local television media for updates on zones being evacuated.

Make sure your home insurance policy is current and remember that standard policies may not cover flood/ wind damage.




