Dear Spring Branch Presbyterian,

Each fall, many congregations in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) celebrate Children's Sabbath — a special Sunday dedicated to lifting up children (2 years old - 5th grade) in worship and recognizing their voices, gifts, and needs within our faith community. This year, we will be celebrating Children's Sabbath on Sunday, October 19th. But what exactly is Children's Sabbath, and how do we observe it?

Children's Sabbath is a joyful opportunity to let children take the lead in worship and remind us all that they are a sacred and integral part of the church right now. One of the most meaningful aspects of Children's Sabbath is the way children are invited to lead worship in age-appropriate and spirit-filled ways. Children are invited to be ushers, acolytes, and/or liturgists/worship leaders. They are also invited to give a short reflection in response to the scripture reading.

At its heart, Children's Sabbath is a time to listen to children — not just with our ears, but with our hearts. It's a moment to affirm that children are beloved by God, and to renew our commitment as a congregation to support and uplift them in every way we can. Children have so much to share with us, and they bring a unique perspective to a worship experience.

So, let's celebrate Children's Sabbath not just as a special Sunday, but as a reminder of the sacred role children play in our life together as the body of Christ.

After all, we are the church together. We build each other up and we support each other. We teach each other and we learn from each other. We love each other and meet each other where we are. We are all faithful, loving disciples who have something to share. So, let's see what each of the children have to share with us that day.

Missions of the Month

The “Mission of the Month” for October is one of our long-term benevolences – Fair Haven Food Pantry, which has been serving our community since 1975. The Fair Haven Food Pantry is one of the largest private food assistance programs in the greater Houston area. Their mission is to provide food assistance until other food assistance is available, or until assistance with food is no

longer needed. Fair Haven is dependent on the donations of congregations and groups.

Fair Haven currently serves over 2,800 families a MONTH. This pantry is a “Client Choice” experience, where the family in need is able to walk through the pantry as if it was a grocery store and choose the items they receive. As a benevolence of the church, Fair Haven Food Pantry receives \$3,500 each year in funds to do as they need with it. Along with that, we accept donations throughout the year to help aid this wonderful mission. Did you know that in the United States we throw away at least 10x as much food as it would take to end hunger?



During this fall season, please pick up a few extra items each week at the grocery store. When you come to church, place your food in one of the Mission Donation boxes outside of the Church Office. Church members deliver regularly to the Fair Haven Food Pantry! Consider signing up on their website to volunteer. Twenty volunteers are needed each day to sort and restock food, and to help serve the clients.





The Houston International Seafarers Center provides a "home away from home" for seafarers visiting the Port of Houston by meeting their spiritual, social and physical needs through support, assistance and fellowship. These outreach efforts improve the welfare of seafarers and strengthen their crews, effectively benefitting the companies in which they operate and the consumers who utilize the goods they transport all over the world.

SPIRITUAL

SHIP VISITS- chaplains / volunteers offer a friendly welcome, an invitation to visit the Center, provide spiritual or practical guidance, and help address any mental or emotional challenges.

PASTORAL SERVICES / BIBLE PROGRAM -worship services are provided in different denominations aboard vessels or at the Center's chapel; bibles are offered in over 40 languages.

CHAPLAIN TRAINING SCHOOL - an annual training school is hosted for Maritime Ministry Chaplains and Managers, coordinated with the North America Maritime Ministry Association.

CHRISTMAS SHOEBOX PROGRAM - complimentary Christmas boxes filled with useful items and small gifts are given to visiting Seafarers.

TRANSPORTATION - a fleet of vans is dispatched to transport Seafarers to the Center, shopping and tourist destinations.

ON-SITE- a comfortable rec room, bar area with snacks & drinks, a chapel for worship, and a one-stop commissary/gift shop are available; a library with books, magazines and games are offered free of charge.

COMMUNICATION / FINANCIAL - SIM/telephone cards are available for purchase, assistance with money transfers is offered, Wifi is provided at the Center and mobile hotspots are available for ships at dock.

SPECIALIZED SERVICES - special medical services (vaccines), research of special requests, resources for hardships and specialized counseling is offered to seafarers.



