From the desk of Pastor Savannah Goodman...

Dear Spring Branch Presbyterian,

As we journey through the season of Advent, our hearts turn once again toward the mystery and promise of Christ's coming. This year, our Advent theme is "Christ in Action." This is a reminder that the birth we await is not simply an event to remember and celebrate, but a living reality that continues to shape and transform our world today.

Advent is a season of waiting. It is a time of active hope – hope that prepares, watches, and works. The Christ we welcome is not distant or dormant. Christ is already at work in our lives, in our community, and in our world. The challenge for us is to see where Christ is moving and join in.

Throughout Scripture, we see Christ in action: healing the sick, welcoming the outcast, challenging injustice, feeding the hungry, and proclaiming good news to everyone. As followers of Jesus, we are called not only to celebrate his coming, but also to embody his presence and his love. This is what it means to be the Church: a people sent out into the world to be the hands and feet of Christ.

Embodying this "Christ in Action" mentality means stepping into the everyday places where love, justice, and compassion are most needed. It looks like checking in on a lonely neighbor, offering forgiveness when it's hard, and choosing kindness. It means using our time, resources, and voices to reflect Christ's presence in real and tangible ways. Whether we're advocating for the vulnerable, volunteering at a food pantry, or simply being a steady source of encouragement, we become living signs of the hope Christ brings. In this way, Advent becomes more than a season – it becomes a movement we join.

So, this Advent, I invite you to reflect on how Christ is moving in your life. Where do you see signs of hope, healing, or reconciliation? And, how might you be called to act as a witness to Christ's presence?

Missions of the Month

Because December is such a wonderful time of giving, we have two "Missions of the Month" for December – The Angel Tree Program and the Presbyterian Children Homes and Services (PCHAS) Ornament Tree.

At any given moment, about 2.7 million children in the U.S. have a mom or dad in prison. Angel Tree®, a program of Prison Fellowship, has been partnering with



churches for almost fifty years. Prison chaplains help facilitate this program to allow incarcerated parents to have a vital connection with their children. The Christmas Angel Tree program gives us an opportunity to share God's love by helping to meet the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the families of prisoners at Christmas time.

Every year, our church receives the names of about 20 children who live in a radius around our church. Through contact with each of the families, we determine items that the children need or want. In addition to two gifts designated from the parent, each family also receives a generous food basket. We will be collecting nonperishable foods for these baskets, so watch for collection bins outside the church office. Here's what you do: select an angel tag (or two). Purchase the gift (*in the \$20-\$30 price range*). Wrap the gift, sticking the tag to the front of the package. Please return the gift to the church office no later than Sunday, December 14th.

We are collecting food for Angel Tree Food Baskets, to be shared with families this Christmas. Here are some suggestions:

- Peanut Butter & Jelly
- Mac & Cheese
- Cereal
- Canned evaporated milk
- Chili or Ravioli
- Canned fruits, vegetables, soups
- Spaghetti, Pasta Sauce
- Canned Tuna or Chicken
- Any kid friendly, easy to prepare foods

December Mission Updates & Opportunities

PCHAS Needs – There are seven Houston PCHAS single family homes. They're currently using just six of them because one is currently being repaired after being damaged in the last hurricane. As of now, they have six moms and eight kids living in these homes.

Here's a general list of their needs:

1. Grocery or gas gift cards – Since Kroger is across the street from their houses, that would probably be the best. But HEB is just down the street. Not all of the clients have cars, but most do.
2. Child care volunteers
3. Job interviews for clients
4. Someone to lead a class on just about any topic that would help the clients, such as: stress management, mental wellness, cooking classes, how to handle finances, creating vision boards, etc.
5. Sheets, towels, pots & pans – When a client graduates, she takes the sheets, towels, pots & pans with her that their family has been using for the last year while they were living in one of the homes.

November Blood Drive Update – Thank you to all who helped make our blood drive a success! We had 10 eligible donors for a total of 12 collected units. Our next opportunity will be in February. Watch for more information to come.

Seafarers' Boxes Updates and Thanks – Thank you to everyone who participated in our annual packing and wrapping of the Seafarer's Boxes on Sunday, November 30th. We had a total 131 of boxes that were packed and wrapped by an enthusiastic group! A special thanks to the Fellowship Committee who provided a yummy breakfast, and to Lu and Jim, who delivered all the boxes to the Houston International Seafarers' Center.


